- Increasing availability of more subjects in senior years.
- I feel like more inclusion of diverse needs as the school does not represent the population so may be quite limiting to different exposures for the children.
- As a school all areas are covered in school my only concern is the safety of children coming in and out of school in the morning and the end of each day.
- More parents evening/progress review meetings.
- Promote their independence a bit more. Allow students to make their way to the classroom independently and after school to make their way to the collection point probably under distance supervision.
