People have created different styles of art at different times. These are called art movements and they include Renaissance, Impressionism Pointillism and Abstract Art.

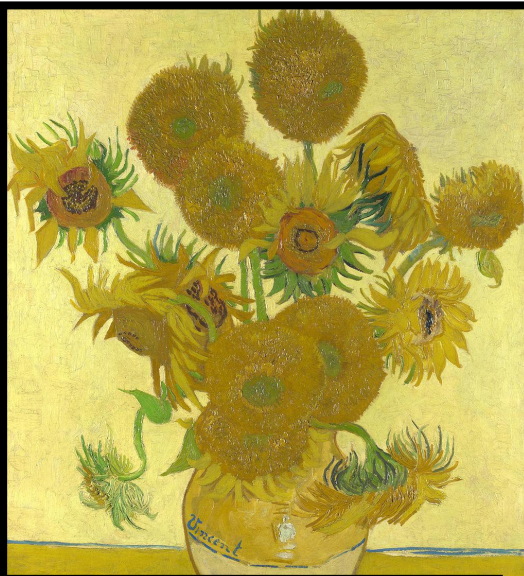
It is thought that the famous artist Picasso's first word was *lápiz*, the Spanish word for pencil.

This pack includes:

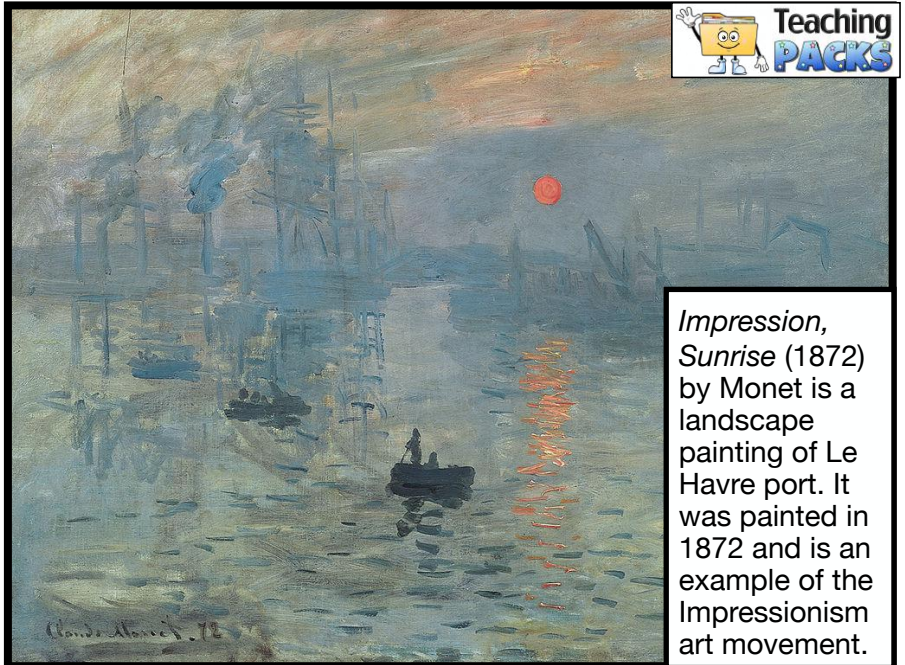
- Pictures of different works of art and information about them,

If you enjoy this project, why not...?

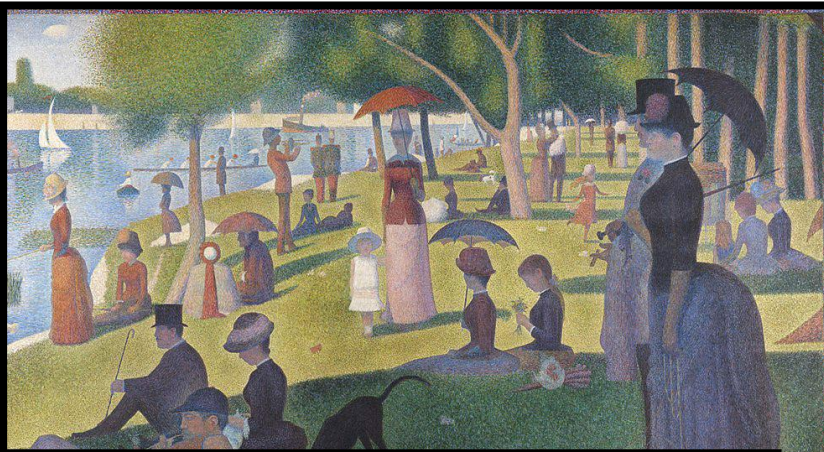
- Visit a gallery online. Here is a virtual tour of the National Gallery in London.

- Find a place to make a gallery in your home. Can you display your work and ask people to visit and enjoy your art?



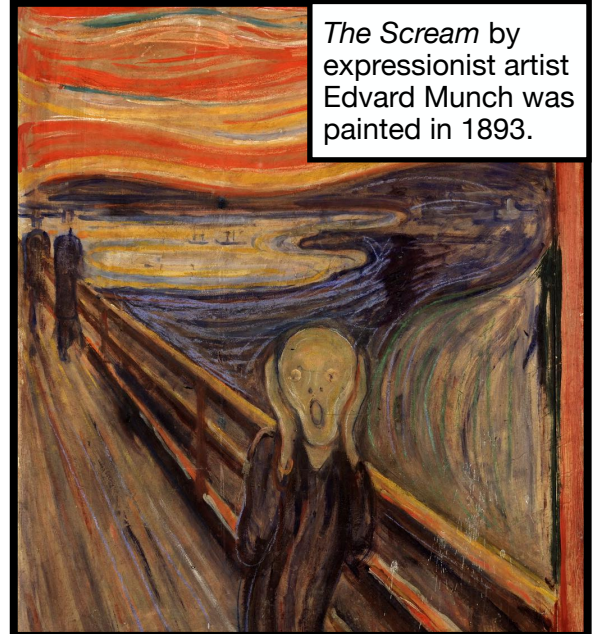
Sunflowers (1888) is a series of still-life paintings by Vincent Van Gogh.



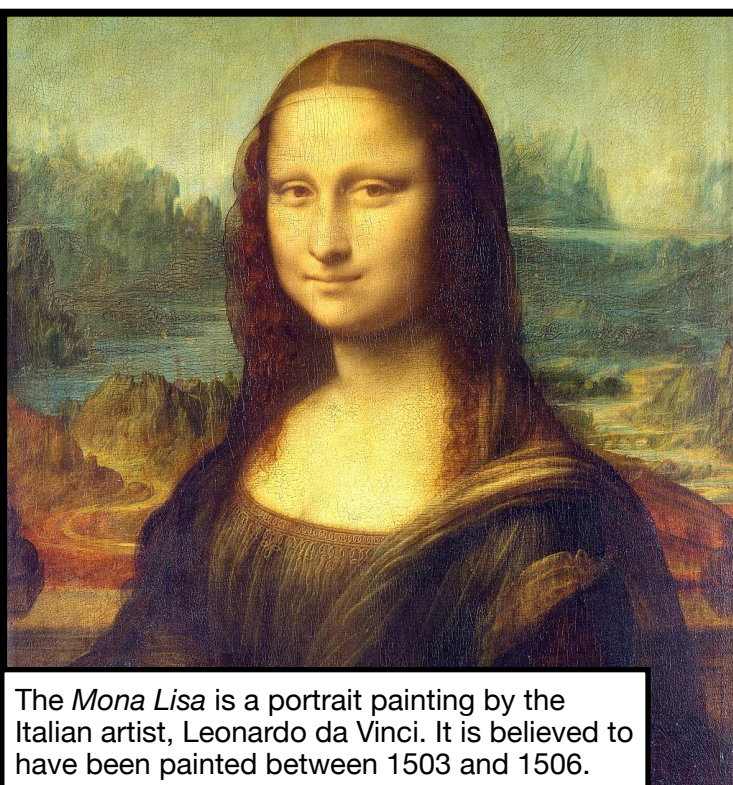
Impression, Sunrise (1872) by Monet is a landscape painting of Le Havre port. It was painted in 1872 and is an example of the Impressionism art movement.



A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte (1884-86) by Georges Seurat is an example of pointillism. This uses small dots of colour to make a larger picture.



The Scream by expressionist artist Edvard Munch was painted in 1893.



The *Mona Lisa* is a portrait painting by the Italian artist, Leonardo da Vinci. It is believed to have been painted between 1503 and 1506.

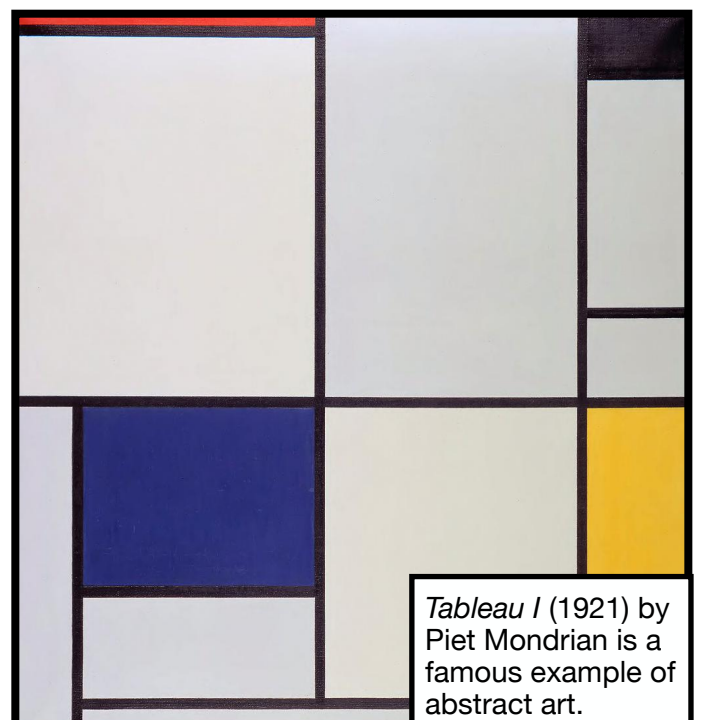
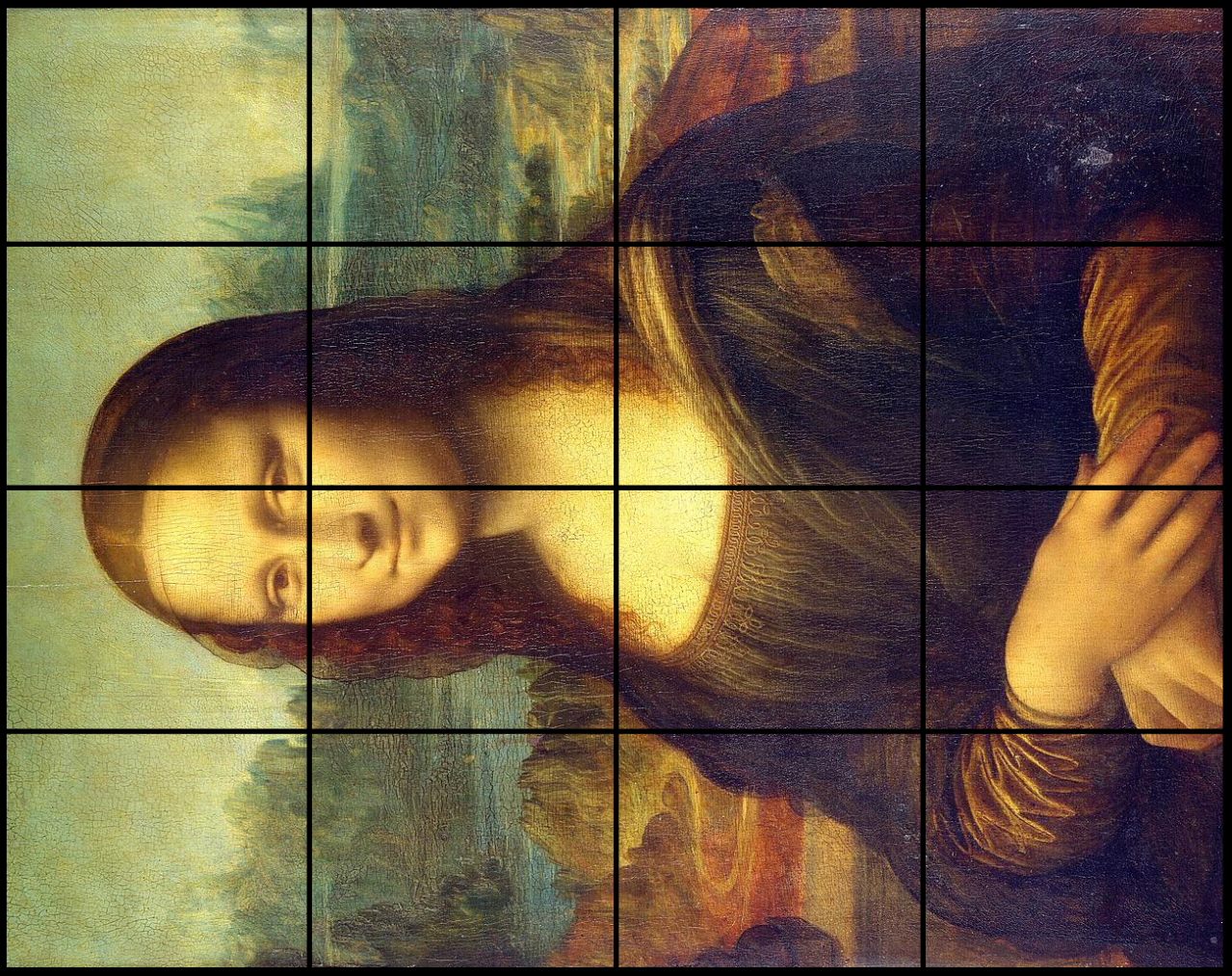
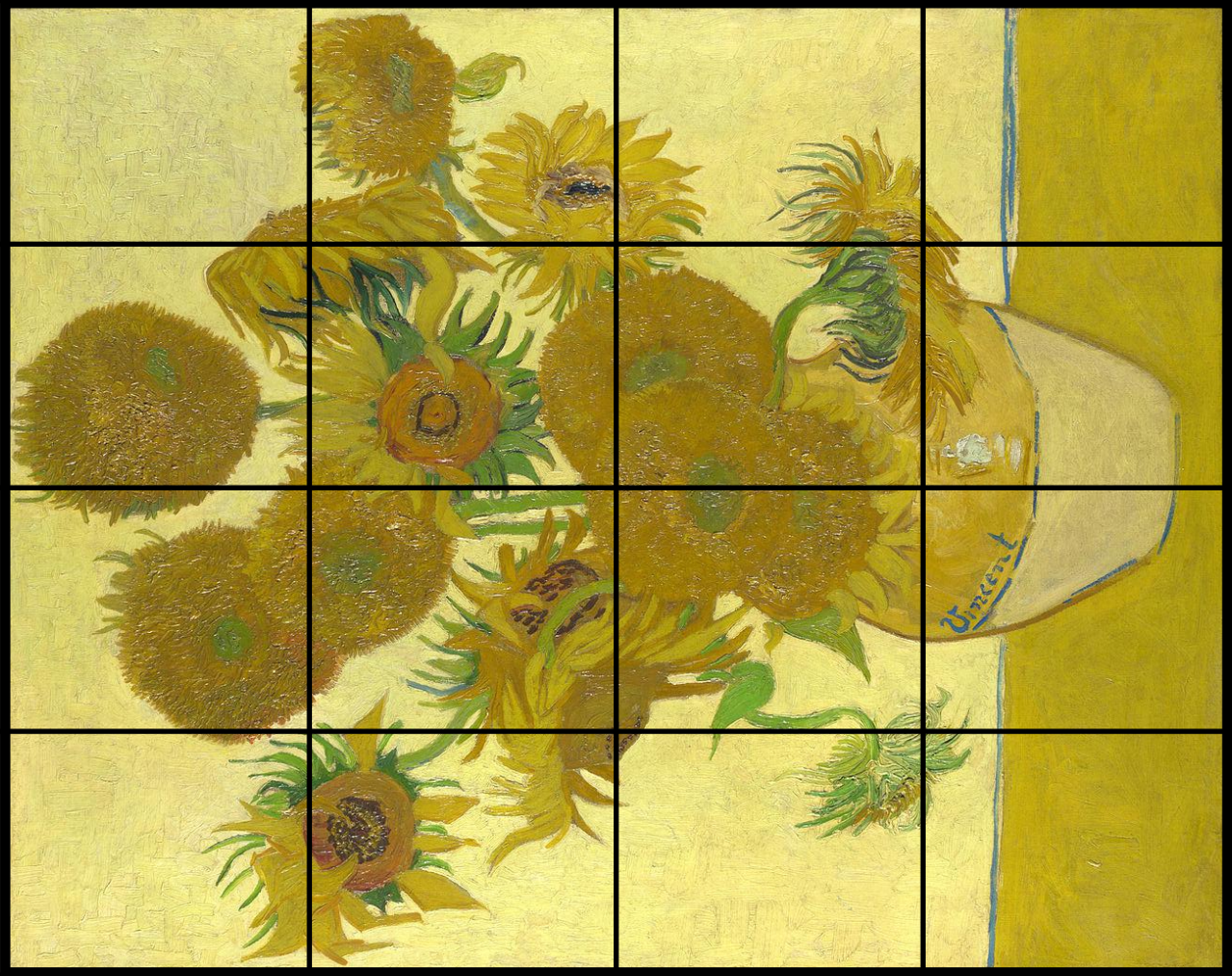


Tableau I (1921) by Piet Mondrian is a famous example of abstract art.

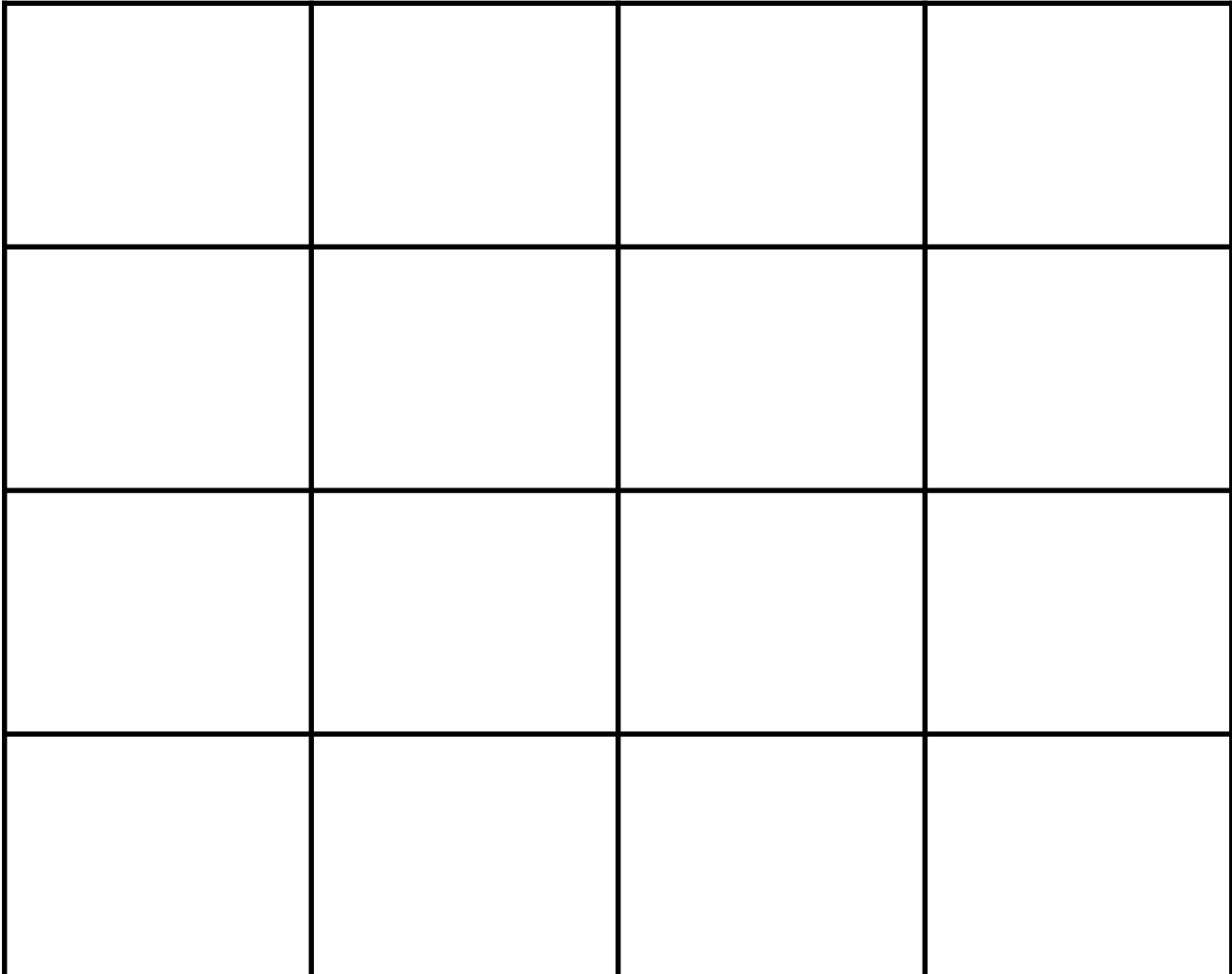
Use this grid to create your own version of the Mona Lisa.



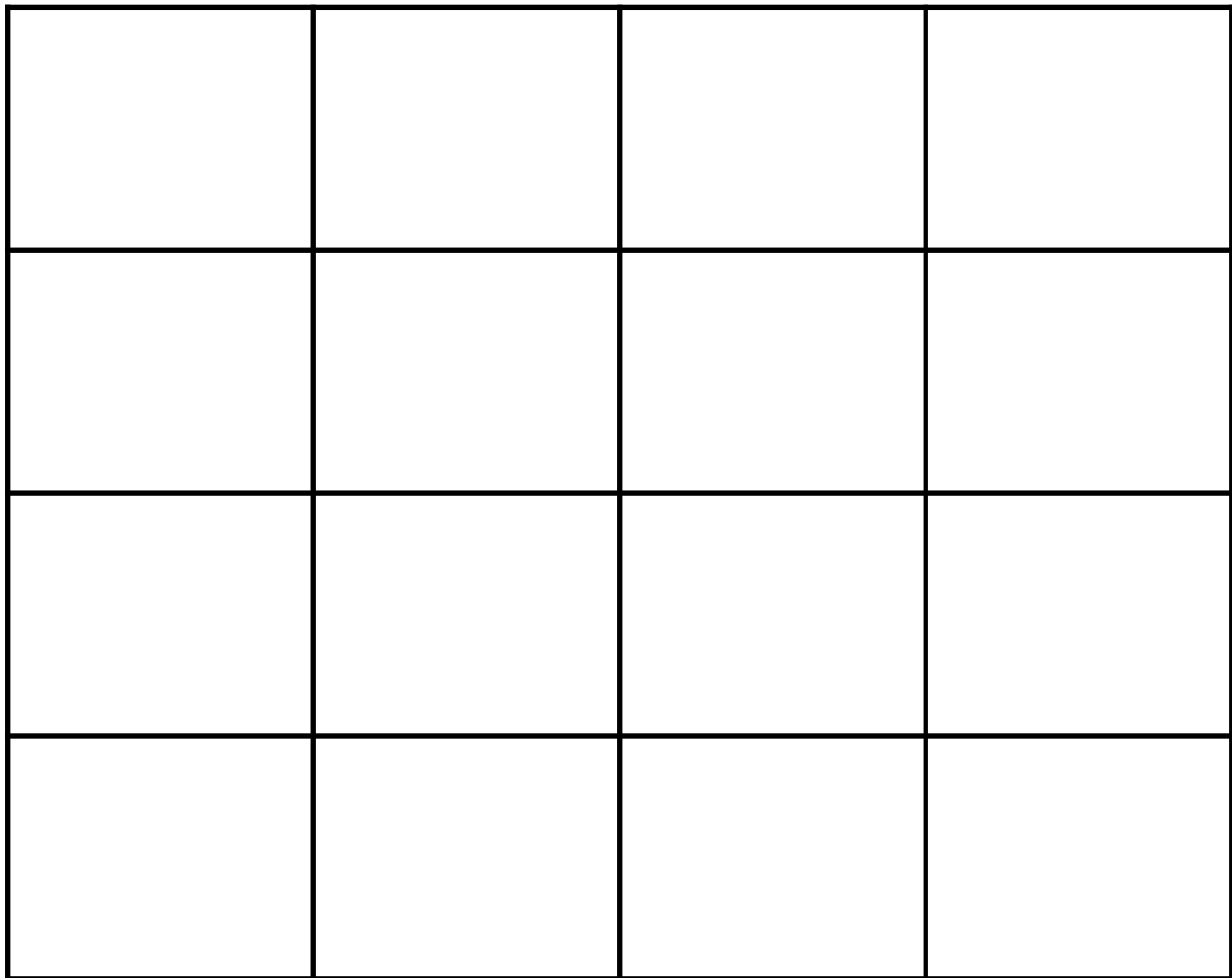
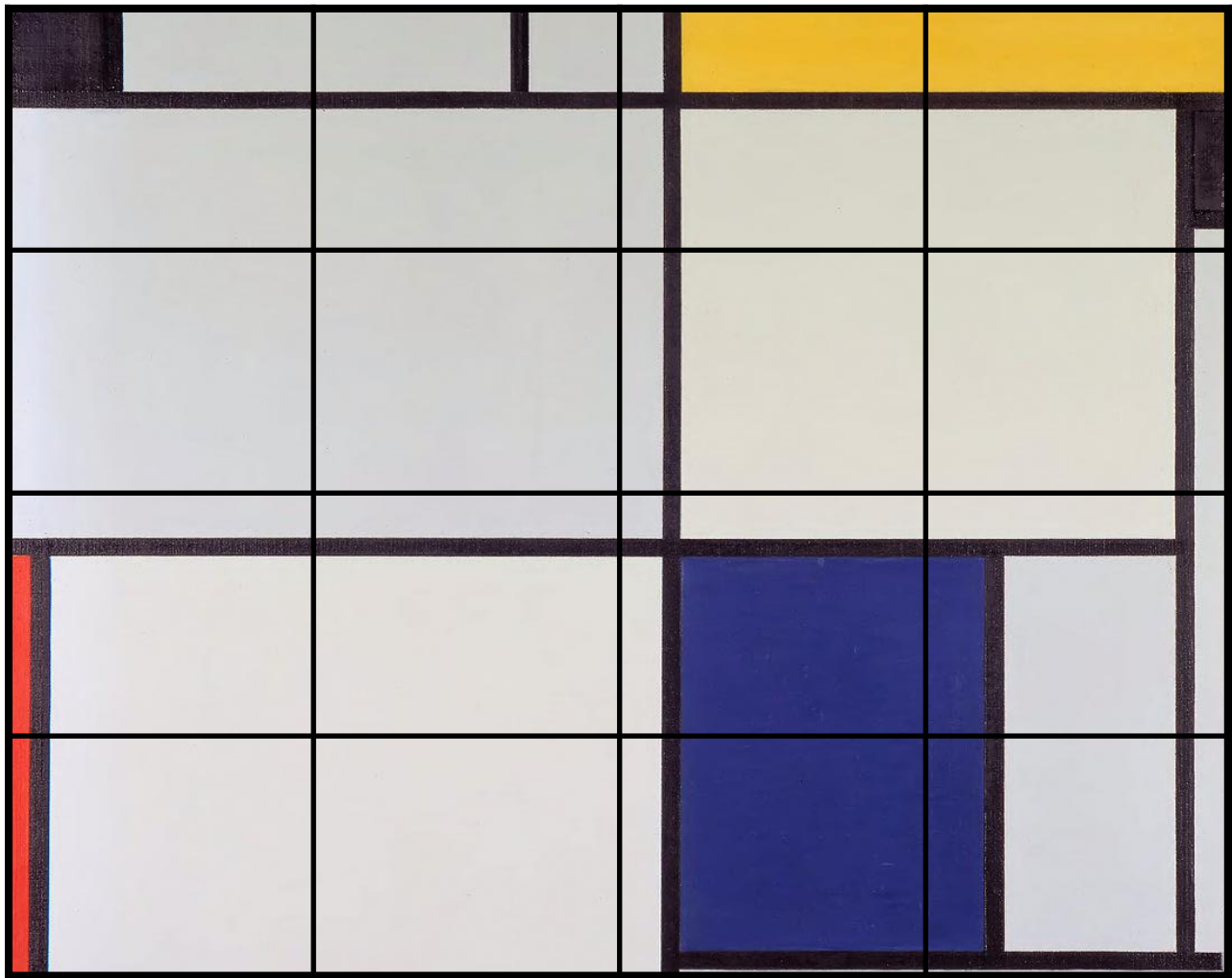
Use this grid to create your own version of the Sunflowers.

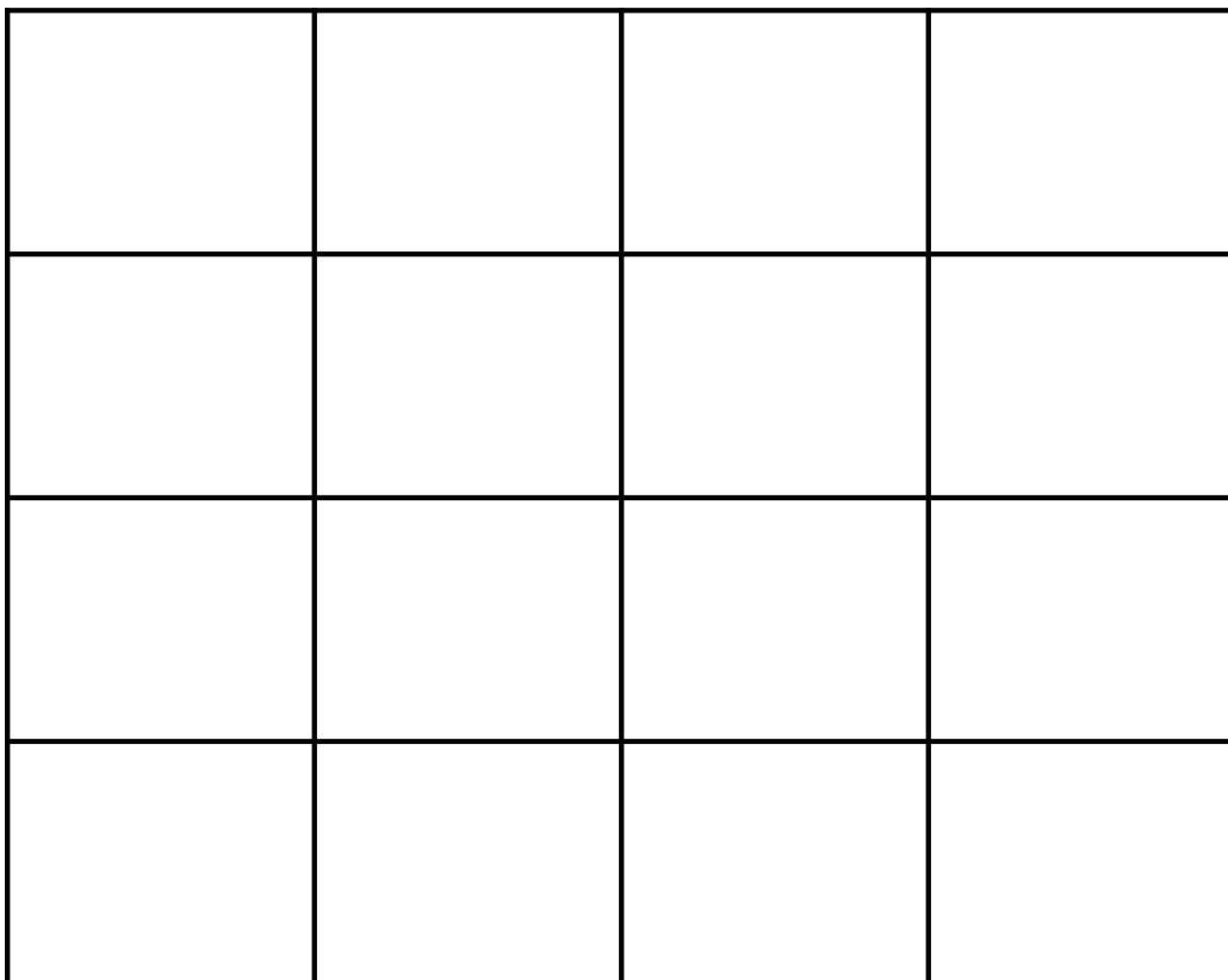
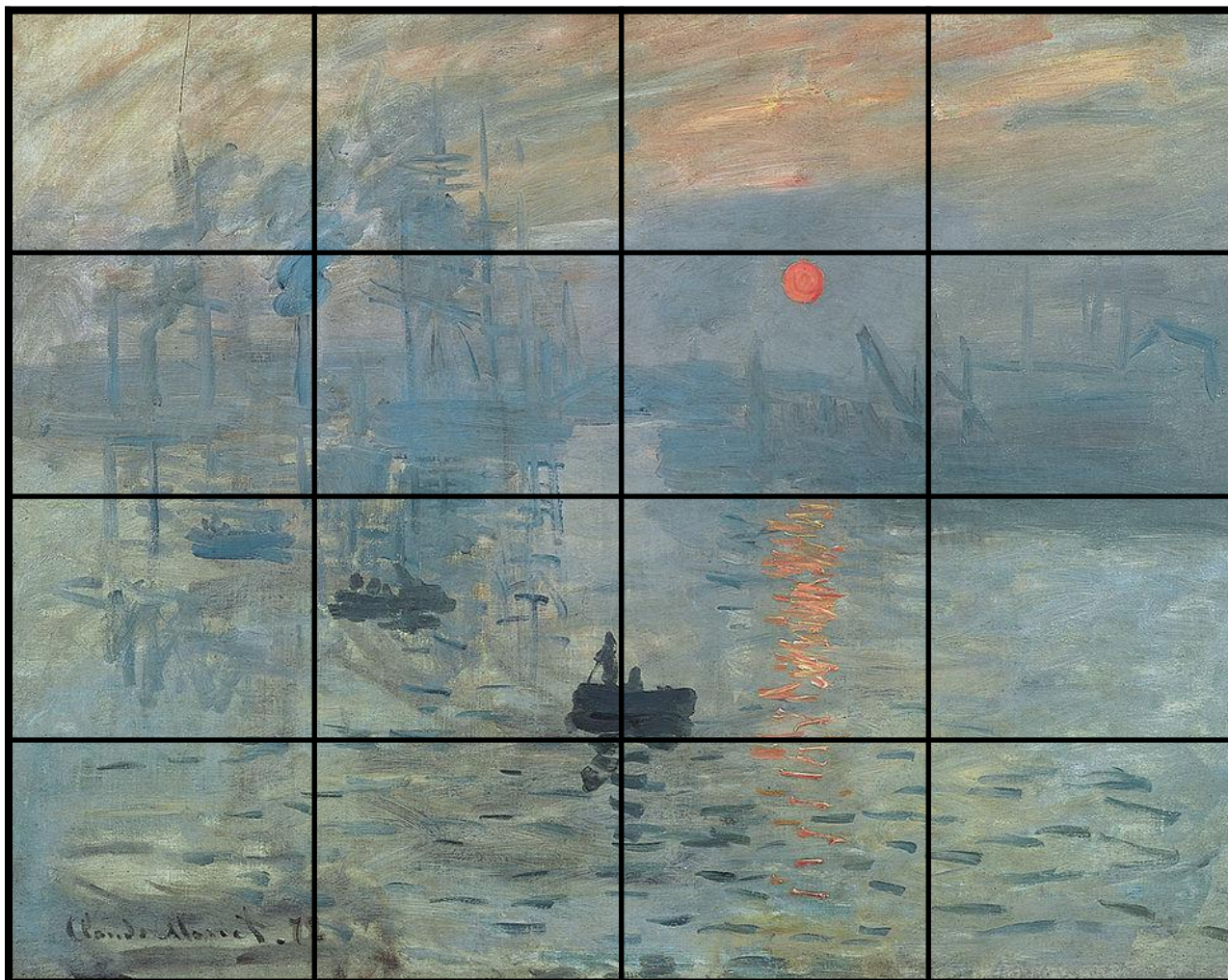


Use this grid to create your own version of The Scream.

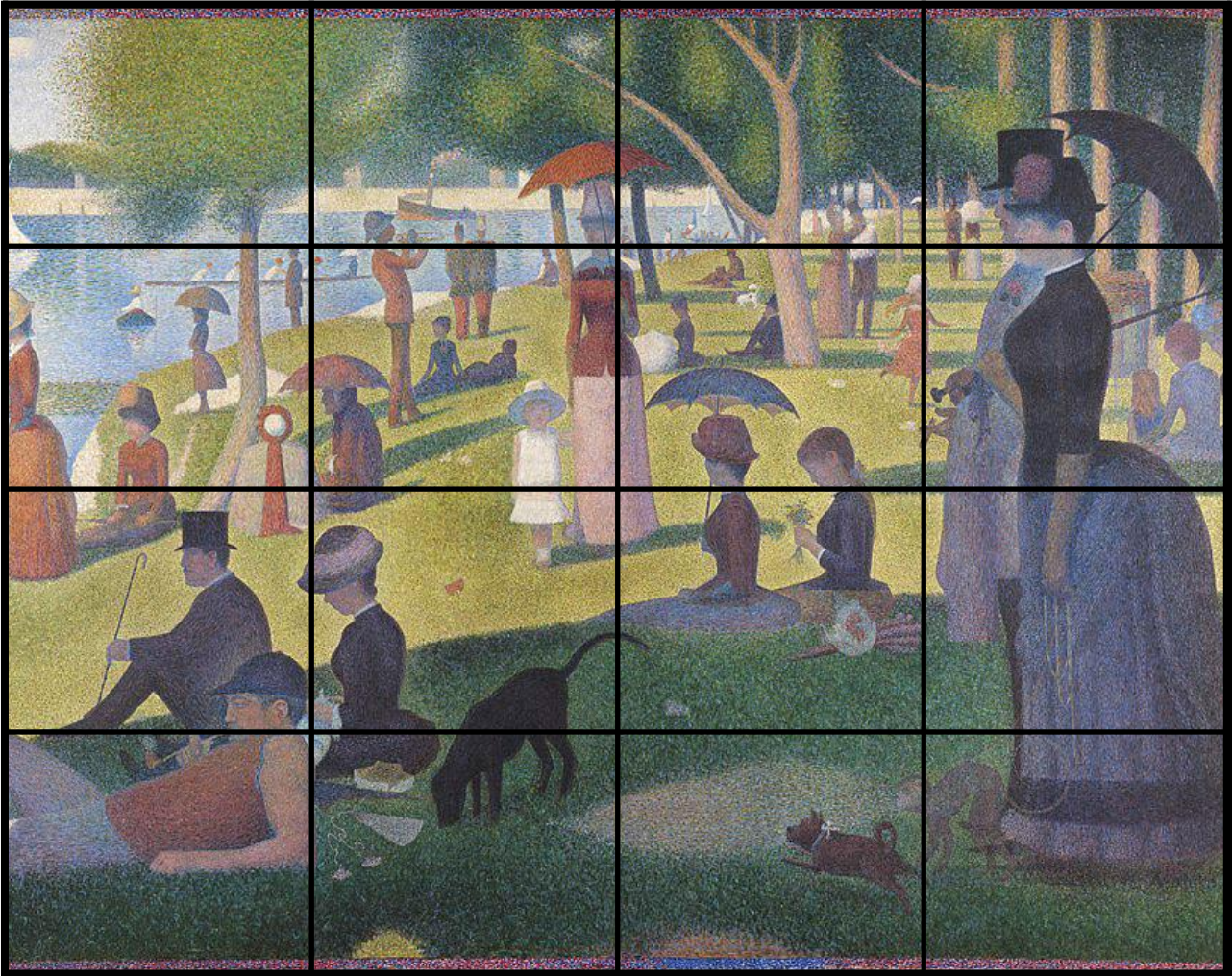
