Post 16 Science

Post 16 students are aware of the problems and dangers of plastic to our planet. Plastic waste takes up approximately 20% of a modern landfill and can take hundreds of years to break down.

In Science with Mrs Beresford, they are experimenting with Bio-Plastic. They will be learning about bio-based and biodegradable bioplastics. These will biodegrade under certain environmental conditions. These materials are suitable for disposable items, such as packaging, drink bottles, single-use food containers and cutlery. They are more sustainable because they save fossil fuel resources and, if disposed of appropriately, support further plant growth.
